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
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
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
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The Future Now: How Entertainers Can Land Brand Deals

OVID-19 has left an indelible mark on the entertainment industry. This is especially for artists who depend solely on revenue from live performances. However, there are several ways artists can make money and survive this pandemic. This article offers one solution - Brand Partnerships.

Brand partnership sometimes referred to as Cobranding, is a mutual agreement between 'Non-Competing brands' to strategically market and advertise a service or product.

In a bid to target markets or seize control target markets, global brands leverage the influence of a music artist or popular entertainer/celebrity to access potential buyers. In most instances, it is a symbiotic relationship. So, engaging in brand partnerships entails targeting a company that will pay you to influence your audience/followers to purchase their product or service. A lot of entertainers break into stardom easily and these brands are mostly willing to work with buzzing/trending acts. For instance, seeing a popular artist like Davido on an Infinix commercial or Wizkid on a United Bank for Africa (UBA) Billboard may signal a successful career and is capable of triggering purchase and even brand loyalty.

Do I have to be BIG before selling myself?

An entertainer does not need to be as big as Wizkid, Richard Mofe-Damijo or Basketmouth to sell or pitch him or herself. Establishing yourself and proving your worth with real-time evidence can get you a deal. It is an open market and thriving entertainers can jump right in. Building a team that can sell and deliver is pertinent. Brands are chasing authenticity.

There are several categories of brands from Beverages, Fashion, Spirits, Automobile, Mobile devices etc. As an artist, make a list of your favorite brands that would love to with, seek them out, and make your pitch!

Actress Beverly was an easy pick for Nivea because of her physical appearance. Her recently released documentary 'Skin' is an added win for Nivea.



Don't Chase the Bag, Chase Career/Partnership Longevity

Most entertainers are focused on chasing money and paying lesser attention on building a brand that can stand the test of time. I always encourage entertainers to go for deals with potential for longevity even in instances where lesser pay is offered. Nowadays you will see a music artist advertising kolaqalagbo. Not every naira is good. If Nigerian adult film actor Krissy Joh advertises kolaqalagbo is very relatable. Go figure..lol Place the long-term benefit before the pay. Aligning yourself with brands not only positions you as a business person but offers you more opportunities to develop and stay relevant. Bear in mind that relevance in the entertainment industry is fluidic. Thus, be futuristic with your decision.

Arm twist brands into partnership

As funny or shocking as this may sound, some brands are way too relaxed. They are not strategic when it comes to picking brand ambassadors or picking partners. However, they may be open to collaboration when approached. Most times their decisions are based on response to competitors. How can you armtwist them?

Nigerian singer and songwriter, Odunsi the Engine in his song "Star Signs" used the spirit brand, Barcardi as the chorus. As the song gained momentum, online fans kept tagging the producers of the spirit, which forced them to respond by saying "We see You Odunsi". Odunsi responded as follows: "Sign the cheques".

The Odunsi case exemplifies how you can feature a

brand until it recognizes your craft and sees a potential market. In my chat with popular Rumors/2baba's unofficial DJ, DJ Preppy on how he bagged a Schweppes endorsement deal. He said: "I started hosting street parties, house parties using Schweppes as the headline refreshment. During those parties, I'll ask a photographer to take pictures and publicize them. I continued until I was contacted by a representative..." This story is similar to DJ Spinall's partnership with Smirnoff.

So you can strategically feature clothing like Fashion Nova or Bandanas in music videos, films or related craft. If well marketed, a brand is most likely to step in to leverage from the traction gained

It must be stated that before approaching brands you need to create and understand the value. What will your potential brand partner gain from you? How will such a partnership grow and sustain your brand? These are the pertinent questions that must be considered before thinking of brand partnership.

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HOW PARENTS

CAN INCORPORATE LEARNING RESOURCES AT HOME TO SUPPORT CHILDREN'S LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT DURING THE EARLY YEARS FOUNDATION STAGE (EYFS).

Due to the pandemic, many parents have come to rely on digital learning and other world-class learning resources which includes hands-on educational resources for the primary aim of keeping their children abreast with educational activities while at home. This is a commendable effort that bridges the gap between teachers and students while they are out of school and also provides an opportunity for parents to bond with their children by participating actively in their activities.

Learning and development are one of the two key areas of the EYFS. It is often said in research that the first five years of a child's life are the most crucial years where the foundation for learning and development is established and help shape the rest of the child's life. There are 7 significant and inter-connected areas of learning and development;

- * Communication and language development.
- * Physical development.
- * Personal, social, and emotional development.
- * Literacy development.
- * Mathematics.
- * Understanding the world.
- * Expressive arts and design.

It's important to remember that all children learn differently. Kinesthetic learners learn by doing or by engaging in activities. Auditory learners learn through hearing, while visual learners learn through seeing. Most children are a blend of these learning styles. It's important to select resources that will benefit children of all learning styles. This might mean selecting blocks or educational toys with kinesthetic learners in mind; music resources with auditory learners in mind; and DVDs or maps for visual learners. Educational videos are tremendous resources that most students enjoy. Just be careful not to over-do it or rely on these too much. Remember, you want to diversify the types of resources you are using.

Finally, you want to ensure that each resource is helping your child discover their strengths and build life skills like problem solving, critical thinking, negotiation, team work, resilience, emotional intelligence, creative thinking abilities amongst others.

Here are a few tips to help you incorporate learning resources at home:

What are Learning Resources and why are they important?

Imagine you as a parent with children in a primary school. The school has outdated and minimal resources. You feel your children are being deprived of essential resources that will help them get the best education possible. It is up to you to research and purchase the best materials, resources, and technologies that will meet the needs of the children but you don't know where to start from.

Popular resources include Art supplies, DIY toys, puzzles, games, Music toys, Board Games, Spelling Toys, Creative illustrated books, Science Toys, Creative Toys, etc.

1. Create an Enabling Environment

An enabling environment is one which provides a rich, varied and safe space in a setting in which children can play, explore and learn. This can contribute greatly to children's learning and development in the early years. The environment should be child-centered and void of distractions to allow the child focus adequately on tasks at hand.

2. Focus on Key Skills

You want to invest in learning resources that not only help your child discover their strengths but nurture and improve their key skills. Rather than dwell on your child's weaknesses or inabilities, invest in resources that will nurture their innate abilities and their skills set.

3. Keep a Routine


Create a daily schedule with your child that includes math and reading as well as choice activities such as drawing, building, DIY or dancing. It doesn't have to be perfect so don't stress. 4. Plan Fun Activities for your family






WOULD YOU SAY YOUR LINE OF BUSINESS IS PROFITABLE?

Are there any resources or tools you'd like to share with other small business owners that helped you grow?



HEALTH TIPS FOR



Writing is such a beautiful endeavor, creating characters and giving them life, personalities, families, friendship and all are priceless and give immeasurable fulfilment. But, writers are susceptible to burnouts because they neglect their health thus impairing their ability to write for as long as they would desire to write.

Having experienced firsthand the frustration of burnouts as a writer, I was inspired to document this piece packed with health tips to enhance the health of writers and set them on a path of life long productivity.

Sleep & Rest: This is coming first because writers, in their bid to write more, neglect their bodies need to sleep and rest. Sadly, sleep and rest deprivation brings on a host of health problems including depression, mood swings, poor eating habits, and weak recovery.

Getting 7 hours sleep each night is the ideal situation as it refreshes the brain and mind to be productive.

Healthy Dieting: Neglecting diets are another cardinal sin committed by writers: their practice is to feast on junk which have little or no benefits to their health. But such practice brings both long term and short term health hazards.

Writers should budget for and organize their meals, and patronize only nutritious foods that will improve both their physical and mental health. And since snack consumption are unavoidable, writers are advised to consume only healthy snack.



Visual Health: The practice of spending long hours writing tends to strain the eyes leading to eye defects. Taking periodic breaks between writing engagements can mitigate these defects.

Exercises such as roaming the eyes about in accordance to the 20-20-20 rule comes really handy. The 20:20:20 rule states that "every 20 minutes, take a 20-second break to look at an object at least 20 feet away".

Fitness and wellness: Though the life of writers are full of deadlines, writers must add "exercise" on their "to-do list" because the body needs exercise. As such, cultivating an exercise habit, or regularly scheduling fitness routines are crucial for writers. Writers should regularly and consistently take trips to gym, and exercise their body at the slightest possible opportunity.

Breaking in between: writing is a painstaking, labor intensive task that stresses the hands, legs, eyes, and buttocks. It is important for writers to take regular breaks in between writing sessions and move, walk, and stretch their hands and legs, as well as roam their eyes.

Meditation; A regular meditation practice brings tons of benefits, including reduced stress and anxiety, lower blood pressures, exercising the brain and mind, and boosting the immunity. It also helps increase creativity and focus (which are necessary for writing). Nothing revives the mind like meditation. As such, it must be a top priority on writer's scale of preference or to-do list.

Sitting Posture: Maintaining a good sitting posture helps prevent spinal cord injuries. Inversely, bad sitting posture (like slouching) reduces productivity, making it hard for writers to concentrate and keep from getting fatigued.

While this is very difficult for most writers, it's a very essential aspect of living a healthy life as a writer. So, ensure you get a comfortable desk and chair that aids good sitting posture.

Social Life: It's common knowledge that writing almost sentences the writer to a life of isolation in a somewhat alternate universe where their living revolves around figments of their imaginations.

While this is beautiful, it might in the long run cause depression and other health problems such as fatigue, stroke, and mental disorders.

It is important for writers to make conscious efforts to participate in the real world, talk to real people, & address real life issues to avoid mental health problems.

Writers should come out of their imaginations regularly and spend some time with their family and friends.

Stay hydrated: Water is an important part of life. Writers must keep it handy, taking periodic sips as they write to keep healthy and hydrated. Occasionally, it is advisable to substitute water with healthy fruit drinks and juice. And be sure to refill your drinking cup as it empties.

Schedules and To-do lists:

Keeping a regular schedule and to-do list is a powerful tool to help writers organize their lives and attend to tasks as at when due.


moviedom

Yes, the internet exposes you to what is happening and available in the world. It also helps to project you to the world when used right and positively


WHAT SOCIAL ISSUES ARE YOU MOST PASSIONATE ABOUT?







Crypto currencies (Bitcoin and Tatcoin) and the Block chain Technology is Changing the Narrative!

The world has definitely evolved with the evolution of money from metallic coins to paper money to credit cards and now to digital currencies with crypto currencies.

Much of these goods are bought from Chinese manufacturers. Nigeria's economy is heavily import dependent and China is a major import partner to Nigeria, Chuta adds.

Consequently, Bitcoin has increasingly become an alternative means for a fast, reliable and less transaction fees for entrepreneurs in Nigeria.

Away from Bitcoin, alternate coins popularly known as alts coins have gain more attentions like Ethereum with its ongoing Block chain system, built also to allow crypto tokens and other smart contracts to be built on it.

In Africa, we have an indigenous crypto currency project, Tatcoin built on the Ethereum Blockchain also changing the narrative as both a system of value transfer and a store of value.

Tatcoin creator, Gaius Chibueze, popularly known as Bitcoin chief says missing buying bitcoin at the dawn of the decade when it was valued at less than a dollar is no long an issue if one has acquired for himself Tatcoin now, especially during it presale when it sold for 3cents. With the surge in the price of Tatcoin, the Utility token has done more than 7x from its initial price at presale. Those who bought at presale have made huge ROI on their assets with even more bigger prospect for the future.

Use cases and adoption is very essential to value of crypto assets and Tatcoin has both as the token is built under an ecosystem, AbiTNetwork with solutions across several industries, like Real Estate, Travels, Agriculture, Games, Clothing, finance etc. as the transactional currency within the ecosystem.








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FALLING IN-LOVE WITH RUNWAY AND FASHION


What do you consider your greatest strength as a model?
